Dear auDA Compliance Team,

Thank you for emailing us the outcome of the investigation regarding our complaint about the domain name [REDACTED].[com.au](#).

We request an internal review of the decision and also use our case for the .au Licensing Rules Review. We request to keep this submission confidential.

About our Business

[REDACTED] Pty Ltd is an Australian Proprietary Company. We develop digital health products such as web applications and software as medical devices, using clinical research and clinical trials. We have been using "[REDACTED]" as the name for our company and business name since 2018.

Since 2018, we have been using the domain name "[REDACTED]healthcare" for our online presence.

It appears that the domain name "[REDACTED].[com.au](#)" is used to refer to the business name [REDACTED] Coordination, and we believe this domain name is used in accordance with the domain licensing rule set out in Article 2.4.4 under the Acronym category.

The use of the acronym "[REDACTED]" as an online identifier for the business name "[REDACTED] Coordination" by a business or company that is not related to us constitutes a misrepresentation of the business operations conducted by [REDACTED] Pty Ltd, as well as those of [REDACTED] Coordination.

Such use is misleading and deceptive to consumers and the general public, and gives rise to significant concerns in relation to consumer protection and fair trading obligations.

Accordingly, we request an internal review of the decision and seek that the registrant be prevented from using the domain name [REDACTED].[com.au](#).

Further, to prevent similar occurrences in the future, we request the introduction of domain name licensing rules that prohibit the registration or use of an acronym or synonym that exactly matches the name of an unrelated company, business, statutory body, or personal name.

Prior to the registration of a ".com.au" or ".au" domain name, a public search of the ASIC registers should be undertaken to determine whether an unrelated company or business is already operating under the same or an identical name.

We refer to your complaint about the above domain name.

We have investigated your complaint and determined that the domain name registration is in breach of domain name rules: .au Domain Administration Rules: Licensing (.au Licensing Rules).

We have instructed the registrar of record to suspend the domain name. The suspension period is 30 days, after which the domain name will move to a 14 day cancellation period.

Once this 14 day period has expired, the domain name will be deleted and purged from the registry. It will become available for registration on a first come, first served basis by the public.

Information about when the domain name will become available for registration can be found on the registry website here: <https://www.identitydigital.au/domain-name-drop-list> when the domain name enters the cancellation period. Dates and times displayed are in UTC time.

Please note that while the domain name is in the suspension and cancellation periods, the registrant is able to provide further information to support their registration of the domain name. If the registrant can provide new information to demonstrate their compliance with the .au Licensing Rules, the domain name may be restored to them. We will notify you if this occurs.

 3. a Match of the Person's Australian Trade Mark; or
 4. a Match to or an Acronym of a name of a Related Australian Body Corporate or
 5. a Match or an Acronym of a name of:
 1. a partnership of which the Person is a partner;
 2. a trust of which the Person is a trustee; or
 6. a Match or Synonym of the name of:
 1. a Service that the Person provides;
 2. Goods that the Person sells (whether retail or wholesale);
 3. an event that the Person registers or sponsors;
 4. an activity that the Person facilitates, teaches or trains;
 5. premises which the Person operates
