.au Domain Administration (auDA) is the administrator of the .au domain name system (DNS), which is Australian critical infrastructure relied on by billions of internet users daily. We are a not-for-profit endorsed by the Federal Government.

Our purpose is to administer a trusted au domain for the benefit of all Australians and champion an open, free, secure and global internet. We support the needs of Australian internet users by:

- · Delivering a stable, secure and reliable .au
- · Implementing .au policy rules that are transparent, responsive and efficient
- Investing in the Australian internet ecosystem to improve the utility of the .au domain.

Through advocacy and active participation, we strive to uphold the multi-stakeholder model of internet governance and the social and economic benefits that flow from it.

Similar to GPS devices which allow people to navigate to physical locations, the DNS connects internet users to virtual locations, helping them quickly and effectively navigate to websites and email addresses. Domain names are part of an internet address that help people find the unique location where website and email addresses are stored online.

Globally, there are more than 1,500 top level domains, which are the characters that follow the last dot in a domain name (e.g. .au, .com, .co). .au is the local and trusted top level domain for Australians and Australian organisations. With more than 4.2 million .au domain names registered, it is among the most popular domains available globally.

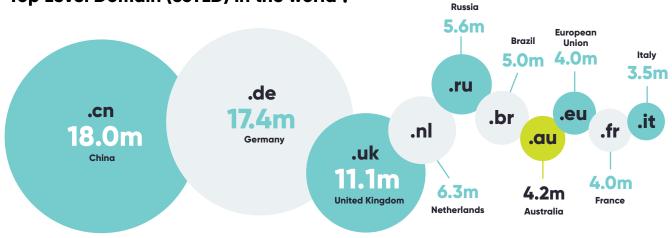

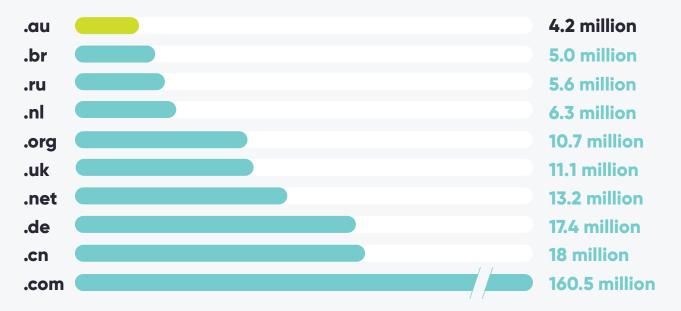
You're in good company with .au

For a country with a relatively small population, .au punches well above its weight. There is almost one .au domain name registered for every five Australians.

.au is the seventh largest country code Top Level Domain (ccTLD) in the world³:



.au is the tenth largest Top Level Domain (TLD) in the world³:



.au DNS servers respond to billions of DNS queries from across the globe each day, evidencing a strong desire for services, goods and information found on Australian websites.

Why Australians choose .au

Australian consumers who have an online presence, or interest in developing one, turn to .au as a trusted, secure option and choose .au to support Australian businesses online.

.au consumers

The top attributes **Australian consumers** associate with .au domain names:









3 of 4 Australians

are more likely to trust an Australian business if the website ends in .au







Half of Australian consumers

(53 per cent) will only purchase from a business online if they have an Australian website ending in .au

Australian consumers choose .au websites when shopping online:



3 of 5 consumers

(60 per cent) To support local Australian businesses



2 of 3 consumers

(65 per cent) So they will be covered by Australian law and consumer protection if there is an issue with the online purchase

Australian small businesses that have an online presence, or interest in developing one, choose .au for their websites and email addresses as it is a recognisable, credible choice that signals to their customers that they are trustworthy and Australian.
