auDA's A secure .au report

Administering a stable, secure and reliable .au is an essential pillar of auDA's work and Q3 was yet another productive quarter for auDA security initiatives.

Our work keeping the .au secure and trusted is extensive, achieved by investing in strong cyber defences and effective compliance activity. This activity is set out in our inaugural **A Secure .au** report, published in January. The report highlights the .au's role as Australian critical infrastructure and auDA's compliance and domain name system (DNS) abuse programs that help ensure valid .au reaistrations.

Supporting our role as a critical infrastructure provider, auDA's security practice is also accredited to international best practice standards. This includes ISO 27001, which sets out best practice information security. During the guarter we passed the ISO 27001 surveillance audit, affirming our commitment to maintaining the highest level of security for .au. Of equal importance are the security standards of auDA's partners. This quarter,

.au accredited registrars each completed an annual Baseline Security Audit, conducted by an external security specialist and affirming key security controls.

We also contribute to **broader local and global policy discussions**. In Q3, there was much discussion on cyber security. auDA's Chief Communications Officer, Sophie Mitchell, spoke at the Clyde & Co Cyber Summit 2024 on safeguarding critical infrastructure in the digital age and implications of the *Security of Critical Infrastructure Act 2018* (Cth) for critical infrastructure providers, while I had the pleasure of hosting a panel of cyber security experts to discuss the 2023–2030 Australian Cyber Security Strategy. It generated a rich dialogue on the strategy and what it means for Australia's digital future.

Internationally over the quarter, I was pleased to join auDA representatives at the 79th meeting of the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN79). We participated in a number of sessions and committee meetings, including a workshop on ESG frameworks for country code Top Level Domain (ccTLD) managers and panel discussion on combatting online abuse. We were also pleased to attend the 85th Asia Pacific Top Level Domain meeting (APTLD85) in the lead up to ICANN, participating in a range of bilateral meetings and discussions on DNS abuse and positioning ccTLDs within the region.


Our .au member team had a strong event schedule in Q3, including conducting a **roadshow of events** in regional New South Wales and Sydney. We conducted the 2024 .au member survey to hear from and help us continue to deliver value to our members. The team was also pleased to support the Women in Tech Fest held in Melbourne, engaging with women from Australia's tech sector and learning about their digital business needs.

During the quarter, we were pleased to announce the 15 successful recipients of the 2023 auDA Foundation community grant round. I extend my congratulations to each of the recipients, whose projects will make a lasting impact on digital inclusion and innovation for Australian internet users. The auDA Foundation forms an important part of our public impact work, supporting innovation for Australians through the internet and we look forward to seeing the outcomes of these important projects as they progress.

Although slightly outside Q3, it is worth noting here that in April I announced I will step down from my role as CEO of auDA at year's end. I would like to express my gratitude to auDA's wonderful multi-stakeholder community, staff and Board for their invaluable contributions and our shared work together. I look forward to continuing to serve auDA and the auDA community for the remainder of 2024. The auDA Board will conduct an open search for a new CEO and I look forward to welcoming the new appointee in due course and helping them transition into the role.
